Have you been to Bathsheba recently? Did you know that the Joe's River Bridge, which was out of commission for over 15 years, has been rebuilt? Not only can you enjoy a beautiful sunrise while in St. Joseph, but you can take a dip at low tide; enjoy an outdoor picnic; or even go on a mini hike! You can literally walk from Bathsheba to Cattlewash and to the East Coast Road without trekking up those steep, beautiful hills. The view as you traverse the bridge is guite surreal - watching how the river flows into sea would certainly make you forget you're still in Barbados! You will need to exercise some caution though, as the bridge has an elevation of more than 50 feet and there are some safety rules that you need to be mindful of, such as: the supervision of children under 12 years of age; the foot traffic only condition of use - even for those with bicycles; and the prohibition of motorised vehicles. Make sure to visit Bathesha soon!
